Vernah Wright Munson Memorial Scholarship

Origin of the Munson Scholarship

The Vernah Wright Munson Scholarship Fund was established in 2014 through a bequest of Marilyn Munson who left a portion of her estate to the Kensington Congregational Church (KCC) to create a scholarship fund in memory of her mother, Vernah Munson. Its purpose is to assist members of the church or their children who are seeking higher education through an accredited college, university, seminary, or other institution of higher education.

A KCC member designated by the Church Committee

Eligibility Requirements

In order to be considered for the Munson Scholarship, the applicant should meet the following criteria:

- Be a member or child of a member of the Kensington Congregational Church
- Be matriculated or accepted to attend an accredited college, university, seminary or other institution of higher education (including graduate or professional study)
- Demonstrate service to the church, school, and/or community
- Have a grade point average of 2.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale)

Selection Criteria

- Complete, and deliver to the church office, the application form (and supporting documents as outlined below) by 12:00 NOON, May 1, 2024 (NOTE: All applications and other documents submitted shall become the property of KCC and will not be returned. Applicants should keep copies for their own records.)
- Provide a most recent official transcript (high school or college)
- Provide a letter(s) of recommendation from a teacher or mentor
- Provide a letter of acceptance from the institution the applicant is planning to attend
- Provide a copy of the financial aid award notice from that institution, if applicable
- Preference is given to those students interested in pursuing the study of religion or Christian ministry
- Financial need may be considered in reviewing the candidate pool

Terms of the Award

The Vernah Wright Munson Scholarship(s) is made in the form of a grant which does not need to be repaid. The selected recipient will be notified in early June of the committee's decision. Funds will be disbursed once the student provides proof of matriculation. The decision of the selection committee shall be sole and final.

Renewal of Awards

The Vernah Wright Munson Scholarship may be automatically renewed for up to a total of four years of undergraduate study, or in the case of graduate study, up to three years, providing the student maintains satisfactory progress (including maintaining a GPA of 2.0 or greater). Leave of absence or transfers to another institution must meet with the approval of the committee before an award can be renewed.

IMPORTANT: Renewal candidates must submit a copy of their Academic Transcript each year, by August 1st
