# A Note from Pastor Holly

#### El Salvador/Pan de Vida

Finally, we were able to have a ZOOM meeting with Pastor Wuilver so that he and Pastor Holly could meet face to face. Julie Smith arranged for a colleague, Guillermo, to act as a translator and all went smoothly. Pastor Wuilver expressed his gratitude and the gratitude of his church members for all of our love and support. He discussed the current state of affairs in El Salvador which basically boils down to not as much overt violence, but the government does not allow any opposition of any kind (verbal or otherwise) and does retaliate against those who oppose them. Corruption continues to abound. Three young women from Pan de Vida are attending university, and we heard about their studies, their dreams, and their struggles. Pastor Wuilver asked about how things are going at KCC and about several individual members that he knew personally. Pastor Holly asked about how we can best support them. We ended the ZOOM by pledging to continue to have ZOOM calls several times a year.

# An Update from the New Organ Team

We have great news on the status of the new Organ for our 250 year old Sanctuary. The New Organ team has been working tirelessly to determine the needs and design of a New organ. They have landed on a New Allen organ setup similar to what we presently have. The cost will be approximately \$145,000 which will be covered by our insurance policy. The final order was placed the week of Feb 19<sup>th</sup>. The goal is to try to have it installed late May early June.

#### Mortgage Update

The balance on our \$150,000 mortgage that completed the Parish Hall construction is now down to \$85,611, at the end of March. The giving efforts of individuals and groups in our Church has been amazing. Check out our "thermostat board" in the Parish Hall for all the details. Our currently low interest rate of 2.87% will adjust in April 2025 and may triple due to higher interest rates. So, the push will continue until we have slaved the mortgage! Many thanks to all who have stepped up!
