## A Note from Pastor Holly

#### Greetings KCC Family,

Excitement is in this beautiful warm air and the call of the outdoors is beckoning! In the life of the church, we are leaning into the coming summer with so many exciting Sundays to come. In this a time of church life transition, we begin to see that we resemble the same transition that the disciples faced after the resurrection of Jesus; the transition from the Easter season, celebrating our Risen Savior, to understanding our own commissioning in the world empowered by the Holy Spirit. At His ascension, Christ ended His time on earth with His disciples. He blessed them and sent them forth to continue to bring the message of God's unconditional love to all people by instilling within them the Spirit. We have received this same commissioning and same Spirit, and we carry within us the power of God to share God's love and affirmation with everyone.

Then, on what we now know as the Day of Pentecost, the church was born in every language in every beautiful iteration of praise, for everyone whom God made! It was the birthday of the church! I don't mean just Kensington Congregational Church, I mean the celebration of this commissioning, this creation of the Church within all people! In the book of Acts, we read the story of Pentecost as the Holy Spirit came down in tongues of fire, allowing people from all over to speak the good news of God, filling them with life and love. From that time, they gathered and spread the good news, thus the church was born on earth. In the spirit of Pentecost, take a moment to reflect with me on our birthday and celebration as a church family.

I believe the reason that the Holy Spirit has been able to lead this church through history rests in our

statement of inclusion. This was powerful when it was adopted, but make no mistake, these words are straight from the heart of the Holy Spirit, working to unify God's people. We find ourselves at a precipice; one that echoes the same moment of Christ's ascension – now what? Where do we go from here? What do we look like now? How do we even start – or – restart?

Well, maybe we start in the same way that the disciples did. Maybe we start by focusing more on what it means to be followers of Christ; to be disciples, and a little less about mechanics of church. Maybe, instead of being the recipients of this church's mission we become the ones responsible for the God's mission! As a body of disciples our energy, our time, our talents are commissioned to look outward into the world and serve as Christ served. This comes with great discernment for each of us and all of us, but with bold choices in faith, trust in God's leading, and an unfailing love for all whom God has created, we have everything we need for this new journey. Let us live the words of our statement of inclusion, one of love and acceptance, of unification and communion, of restoration and affirmation, and let us celebrate our birthday as a church praising God! Be together; not the same.

Brunch will include: Pancakes, turkey sausage, fresh fruit, and hot & cold beverages.


A free-will offering will be collected for our youth Workcamp group traveling to Erie, PA this summer.
